Revised Tariff of Rates for Lancaster County (Outside the Cities of Columbia and Lancaster), Pennsylvania, Adopted by the Underwriters' Association of the Middle Department. Philadelphia: Otto-Jones Co., 1908. The book lists many county businesses, with owners' names and often with street locations, and comments on the state of fire protection in each of the boroughs included. Some dwellings are listed as well. There are 49 pages (small format) of listings for Ephrata Borough, 21 for Denver, 2 for
